## UK Household Debt

f People in the UK owed f 1.458 trillion at the end of November 2015. This is up from $\mathrm{f1.423}$ trillion at the end of November 2014 - an extra $£ 708.35$ per UK adult.
$\mathfrak{f}$ The average total debt per household - including mortgages - was $£ 54,012$ in November. The revised figure for October was $£ 53,923$.
f Per adult in the UK that's an average debt of $£ 28,877$ in November - around $113.3 \%$ of average earingss. This is up from a revised $£ 28,829$ in October.
$\mathfrak{f}$ Based on November 2015 trends, the UK's total interest repayments on personal debt over a 12 month period would have been $£ 52.847$ billion. That's an average of f145 million per day.
£ This means that households in the UK would have paid an average of $£ 1,957$ in annual interest repayments. Per person that's $£ 1046-4.1 \%$ of average earnings.
